

**Mission:**

The Emerge Owensboro Program is a joint program of the Greater Owensboro Chamber of Commerce and the Greater Owensboro Economic Development Corp. and is focused on educating and engaging individuals to reach their potential and maximize their impact in the community.

Emerge Owensboro will expose participants to a variety of Greater Owensboro topics and issues as well as teach leadership skills and applications. The region is at a crossroads of opportunity and challenges, and participants will learn how they can play a role and gain foresight and initiative.

Objectives of the Program:

- Improve the quality of life in the Greater Owensboro region through training leaders
- Identify key individuals with demonstrated leadership qualities and concern for Owensboro's future
- Develop a systematic educational program to familiarize these participants with our community's opportunities, needs, problems and resources
- Expose participants to a wide variety of current local leaders and notable persons through various types of networking opportunities
- Encouraging independent thinking, fresh perspectives, and approaches
- Acquaintance with relevant community issues, their history, and future possibilities

Expectations:

As a participant in the Emerge Owensboro program, it is expected that you attend every scheduled session. Full participation is best in order to get the most out of the activities included in the program. Each class member must attend at least 80% of the scheduled sessions in order to graduate from the program. This means you may not miss more than two sessions. You will also be required to complete assignments as well as attend certain community meetings and events outside of the scheduled class dates.

Class Dates/Times:

The 2011-2012 Emerge Owensboro program will begin with a full-day session on **Thursday, September 8, 2011** in Owensboro. Attendance at this opening session is **mandatory**. *If you cannot make this class, do not apply for Emerge Owensboro this year.* Most class sessions will be held on the second Thursday of each month through April, 2012 with graduation held at the May 3, 2012 Rooster Booster Breakfast. Class days will vary between half-day and full-day sessions. Please see the tentative schedule below. It is anticipated the class will take a full day trip to Frankfort, KY in February.
