

Professor John Baker

John Baker is a faculty member and the Education Coordinator in the Leadership Studies Program, part of the Center for Leadership Excellence at Western Kentucky University. As a faculty member in Leadership Studies, Mr. Baker teaches undergraduate and graduate leadership courses, conducts leadership seminars, and provides leadership education and training to off-campus constituents. Mr. Baker received his BS degree with a concentration in Geography from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1980. He also earned MS degrees in Physical Geography from the University of Wisconsin (1990) and in Engineering Management from Drexel University (2000). He is presently a doctoral student in Educational Leadership at Western Kentucky University. Prior to joining the Leadership Studies Program in 2006, Mr. Baker was an officer in the US Army where he spent over 26 years on active duty serving throughout the continental United States, Europe, and Japan, retiring at the rank of lieutenant colonel. As an Air Defense Artillery officer, Mr. Baker had assignments to Germany (1981-1984), Fort Ord, California (1984-1987), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii (1994-1997), and Japan (2001-2003). After attending graduate school, Mr. Baker was an instructor at West Point (1990-1993) in the Department of Geography and Environmental Engineering where he taught Terrain Analysis, Climatology, and Military Geography. Mr. Baker was the Professor of Military Science and Leadership at both Drexel University (1997-2001) and WKU (2003-2006). He is also a graduate of the Army's Command and General Staff College (1994).
